

Innovative Curriculum Funding Award: Call for Submissions 2025-2026

The San Gorgonio Education Foundation (SGEF) is pleased to announce the 2025-2026 funding cycle for the **Innovative Curriculum Project (ICP)**. This initiative seeks to foster educational innovation by supporting projects and proposals that enhance student engagement, improve educational outcomes, and address critical community issues.

SGEF has a long-standing commitment to the Banning Unified School District (BUSD) and the students it serves, including those who reside in neighboring areas such as Cabazon, Whitewater, and the Morongo Reservation. Through this funding opportunity, we aim to expand our reach and further develop the collaboration between school district staff and community organizations.

A panel of judges composed of Banning community members will score applications and select the recipients of this SGEF funding award. To maintain discretion, judges will review redacted applications when scoring. Please review the application guidelines below before submitting your proposal.

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

- Applications will only be accepted from Banning Unified School District educators, staff, and other personnel or teams.
 - o Examples include but are not limited to, teachers, nutritionists, custodians, aides, office staff, counselors, specialists, administrators, librarians, et al.
- Applicants can apply for up to \$4500.
- There is no restriction on the number of separate applications submitted from any one school.
- Applicants must include a budget that supports the project.
- Late submissions will not be accepted.
- Applications must be submitted no later than **September 8th**, **2025** to sangorgonioeducationfoundation@gmail.com
- After funds are dispersed and the innovative project is complete, the recipient of the funding must provide a report or presentation detailing the learning outcomes and results of the implemented project. Copies of all receipts pertaining to project expenses must be provided. Failure to provide a final report or presentation to SGEF by June 30th, 2026, will result in disqualification from future funding opportunities. Please keep a copy of your application and curriculum plan for your records.

Application Requirements

Applicants must submit a complete proposal including the following:

Part 1: Project Narrative

1. **Project Information**

- o Goals and objectives of the project.
- Description of how the project is innovative and addresses critical community issues such as food insecurity, civic engagement, climate resilience, or educational inequities.
- Explanation of planned activities and how they will enhance the students' educational experience.
- Identification of the measurable outcomes or impact on the target population. Please describe your target population for the project (e.g., individuals experiencing food insecurity, justice-impacted minors)

2. Collaborative Element:

- Proposals must demonstrate a partnership between school staff and at least one community-based organization (e.g., local church, nonprofit, business).
- Applicants should outline how the partnership will support the project's implementation and success.

3. Evaluation Metrics:

- Create a plan to measure how well your project works by:
 - i. Counting how many students and community members participated or were served.
 - ii. Gathering feedback through surveys, interviews, or stories to show the project's impact.
 - iii. Tracking improvements in the community, like new partnerships or better access to resources.
 - iv. Summarizing these results to show what worked and what can be improved.
